

~AMERICA'S MOST SUCCESSFUL HIGH SCHOOLS-WHAT MAKES THEM WORK~

Summary: “The 30 high schools included in the Bringing Best Practices to Scale initiative, co-sponsored by the International Center for Leadership in Education and the Council of Chief State Schools Officers with financial support from the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, have provided great insight into how American high schools can help all students complete an academically rigorous and relevant curriculum. Especially insightful is the comparison of findings from these 30 high schools to the many good high schools that will need to make some further changes before they can be classified as great in terms of all students’ academic success.”

Overview of Findings:

1. Focusing instruction around students’ interests, learning styles, and aptitudes through a variety of small learning community approaches, most commonly academies
2. An unrelenting commitment by administrators and teachers to excellence for all students with a particular emphasis on literacy across the curriculum
3. A laser-like focus on data at the classroom level to make daily instructional decisions for individual students
4. An extraordinary commitment of resources and attention to 9th grade students
5. A rigorous and relevant 12th grade year
6. High-quality curriculum and instruction that focuses on rigor, relevance, relationships, and reflective thought
7. Solid and dedicated leadership
8. Relationships driven by guiding principles
9. Sustained and supported professional development
